

ADJUNCT INSTRUCTOR OF ANATOMY AND PHYSIOLOGY

RESPONSIBILITIES AND QUALIFICATIONS

University of the Ozarks invites applications for a current opening as an adjunct, non-tenure track Instructor of Anatomy and Physiology beginning January 2019. The position is for teaching one section of first-year Anatomy and Physiology II in the Spring 2019 semester. A fall semester course may be a possibility depending on departmental needs. Preference will be given to those candidates that have earned a M.S. or Ph. D. degree in Health Science, Physiology, or a related field by the time of employment, although ABD will be considered. The desired applicant should have previous teaching experience and the ability to work as part of a team to promote our Health Science program. The primary responsibility of this position will include teaching one section of Anatomy and Physiology II and laboratory in the Spring 2019 semester.
