

## VISITING ASSISTANT PROFESSOR OF ART

## RESPONSIBILITIES AND QUALIFICATIONS

University of the Ozarks invites applications for a current opening in the Art department as a 3 year Visiting Assistant Professor of Art with specialization in Photography, beginning July 1, 2022. Candidates must be motivated to work with students from all disciplines and majors, complementing the current faculty in Art within the Division of Humanities and Fine Arts and across divisional boundaries. This position is a 3:3 load; teaching eighteen (18) credit hours per academic year, and will be responsible to maintain and manage the photography studio and equipment, and work with departments to produce promotional products.

The ideal applicant for this position would hold a MFA or MA in Photography or a masters in a related photographic field from a regionally accredited university. Preference will be given to applicants with higher-education teaching experience and are active with their photographic practice. Applicants should submit 20 images of artwork, 20 images of student artwork and an artist statement.

University of the Ozarks values personal attention and collegiality, thus a familiarity with and understanding of a small and residential campus are highly desirable. A sincere interest in students, excellent communication skills, and support of the University's mission are also required.
