

ASSISTANT PROFESSOR OF COMPUTER SCIENCE

RESPONSIBILITIES AND QUALIFICATIONS

The University of the Ozarks invites applications for a new position in Computer Science. The new position will be a tenure track Assistant Professor of Computer Science beginning July 2025. Candidates should have earned a Ph.D. in Computer Science or a closely related discipline. Candidates with tested industry experience without a PhD will be considered if they can demonstrate a commitment and ability to teach undergraduates. This position's primary responsibilities include teaching courses focusing on information technology, network security, programming, management of information systems, and database management. Candidates interested in and able to build a new program will be given preference.

The University of the Ozarks values personal attention and collegiality, so familiarity with and understanding of a small, residential campus are highly desirable. Candidates should also demonstrate a strong interest in working with a culturally diverse student body. Excellent communication skills and support of the University's mission are also required.
