

ASSISTANT PROFESSOR OF MUSIC

RESPONSIBILITIES AND QUALIFICATIONS

The University of the Ozarks invites applications for a current opening as a tenure track Assistant Professor of Music beginning July 2025. Candidates must be motivated to build a music program by working with both beginning and experienced student musicians and by complementing a faculty member with a specialization in piano. The desired applicant would have at least a Master of Music degree or a Master of Arts degree in music and the ability to teach courses in conducting, music history, and music technology. Preference will be given to those with experience in choral direction. The teaching load is 4:4, or 24 academic credit hours per academic year. Additional expectations for the role include advising students, participating in the university's shared governance, and ongoing professional development.

The University values personal attention and collegiality, and a familiarity with and understanding of a small residential campus are highly desirable. Candidates should demonstrate a strong interest in working with a culturally diverse student body. Excellent communication skills and strong support of the University's mission are also required.
