RESPONSIBILITIES AND QUALIFICATIONS

The University of the Ozarks invites applications for a current opening as a tenure-track Assistant Professor of Piano/Staff Collaborative Pianist starting Fall 2024. The primary responsibilities of this position include teaching individual, Applied Piano lessons to undergraduate music majors, music minors and elective students, and piano accompanying of all vocal ensembles and Applied Voice students in rehearsals, recitals, concerts, semester-end juries, studio performance seminar/master class, touring performances, competitions, prospective student auditions, recruitment and outreach events, special liturgical services of the University Chapel, and special events of the University.

Requirement of a minimum of a Master of Music or Master of Arts degree in Collaborative Piano, Piano Performance, or related field, with professional-level collaborative piano and piano instruction experience. Preferred undergraduate-level collaborative piano and piano instruction experience and Organ Performance.

The University values personal attention and collegiality, and a familiarity with and understanding of a small residential campus are highly desirable. Candidates should demonstrate a strong interest in working with a culturally diverse student body. Excellent communication skills and strong support of the University's mission are also required.
