

INTERNATIONAL ADMISSION COUNSELOR

JOB SUMMARY/OBJECTIVE:

The international admission counselor, in collaboration with the Director of Walton International Scholars Program & International Program Manager and the International Student Recruiter and Success Consultant will recruit, screen, and select international students for F1 and J1 enrollment.

The international admission counselor is responsible for overseeing the internationalization of our campus community through strategic partnerships and location expansion. The international admission counselor will assist international students with all visa and immigration documents. The international admission counselor will collaborate with the admission and athletic departments to promote, recruit, and retain F1 and J1 international students.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Possess a strong understanding of the University's mission statement and strategic enrollment goals and how they relate to international recruitment and programming.
- Research international education systems, global trends, current events, and market developments that may impact international recruitment, and maintain current knowledge.
- Develop a strong understanding of strategies for international recruitment.
- Assist in maintaining current international markets while also helping to identify new markets for recruitment opportunities.
- Develop and maintain relationships with prospective international students from the point of application through to enrollment.
- Attend area meetings as requested by the supervisor.
