

PHYSICAL PLANT, MAINTENANCE TECHNICIAN

Summary:

The Maintenance Technician reports to the Assistant Director of Physical Plant. This position is responsible for the completion of all maintenance work requests and work orders as assigned. The Maintenance Technician can assist in monitoring all work performed by outside contractors.

Duties and Responsibilities:

Duties include but are not limited to:

- Perform routine carpentry, electrical, plumbing, HVAC, and/or building repairs in accordance with preestablished procedures.
- Perform and record basic preventative maintenance tasks such as checking specific mechanical equipment, changing filters, recording temperatures or other comparable tasks.
- Installs and maintains plumbing fixtures such as sinks, taps, faucets, commercial kitchen and laundry equipment; various equipment using steam/water and return or waste disposal lines.
- Operates, maintains and repairs various types of equipment used in the maintenance of building such as trucks, fork-lifts, power tools, etc.
- Set up and tear down of furniture, staging, etc. for events
- Vacuuming and mopping as needed
- Assist in snow removal as needed
- Be available for rotating on-call service
- Be available to provide emergency and unexpected services during unscheduled work hours as directed by your supervisor on a monthly on-call rotation.
- Treats each student, visitor, and employee with courtesy.
- Other duties as assigned.

Skills and Abilities:

- Willingness to learn
- Excellent organization ability, high level of accuracy, attention to detail
- Effective interpersonal and communication skills in dealing with others to ensure that requests or needs are met.
- Problem solving skills including the ability to acknowledge and clarify inquiries, requests, or complaints to ensure that needs are identified, documented and addressed
- Ability to prioritize and manage multiple tasks simultaneously and with minimal supervision
- Enjoy working with college students

- 2-3 yrs. experience with building controls
- 2-3 yrs. experience with commercial electrical including 3 phase
